Part I: The opportunity

The Rural Health Transformation Program (RHTP), created by H.R. 1 (One Big Beautiful Bill Act), represents a 5-year opportunity to catalyze system-wide change and address core health challenges in Utah's rural communities.

Part II: Utah's application submitted to CMS November 5

Utah's comprehensive plan, built on extensive stakeholder engagement and aligned with the CMS Notice of Funding Opportunity, organizes its efforts around **four strategic goals** to improve outcomes, access, and quality while strengthening workforce in rural communities. Utah plans to drive progress on these outcomes through **seven broad initiatives** in partnership with state, local, tribal, and community stakeholders across rural Utah.
